<p>Separation or Divorce after the FAFSA was filed</p> <p>(You or your parents separated or divorced after completing 2022-2023 FAFSA)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Signed appeal form with explanation of circumstances • Proof of separation • Lease or mortgage for each parent showing separate addresses • Utility bills for each parent showing separate address
<p>Death of a Parent or Spouse</p> <p>(Your spouse or parent listed on the FAFSA died after filing 2020 taxes)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Signed appeal form with explanation of circumstances • Death certificate • 2020 W2s and taxes • Death benefits information
<p>Medical/Dental Expenses</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Only paid expenses are considered</i> • Paid expenses incurred in 2021 or 2022 • 2020 expenses that are not itemized on the taxes 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Signed appeal form with explanation of circumstances • Proof of all out-of-pocket payments reported
<p>One Time Lump Sum Payment Received</p> <p>A payment received in 2020 and reported on the taxes filed</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Signed appeal form with explanation of circumstances • 2020 taxes and W2s • 2019 and 2021 taxes • Documentation confirming the amount of the distribution
